#### **EDITORIAL**

2018 is a blossoming year for the Champ'seed Foundation!

Like their glorious eldest and "big brother" Stefanos Tsitsipas (now no. 8 in the ATP world ranking), our young players - thanks to the support of our generous donors - have dazzled all the tennis courts in the world with their talents.

5 Grand Slam finals out of eight possible, including 3 won, 1 world champion title for the boys, 2 victories for the girls in the under 12 and under 18 categories at the prestigious Orange Bowl tournament (the world's greatest reference aside from the Grand Slams). The Champ'seed Foundation has come so far since its creation in October 2014!

Under the aegis of Fondation de Luxembourg, Champ'seed Foundation has already enabled 28 youngsters, aged 10 to 22, to be awarded grants to cover their sports training, their physical preparation, their medical bills and their costs relating to the facilities and equipment needed for their education and training. Champ'seed Foundation also allocated grants to cover their travel costs for their attendance to practice and tournaments as well as to help these youngsters prepare their entry in the professional world, on and off a tennis court. These young talents were able to benefit from the expertise of Champ'seed Foundation collaborators and the facilities of the Mouratoglou Tennis Academy which are made available to them, free of charge.

This report is the opportunity to thank all the donors and partners of Champ'seed Foundation for their generosity and their support which enable our players to build their outstanding future as athletes. This chance for a professional career, the children also owe it to the commitment of the technical training staff, the caregivers and the volunteers implicated on the board and in our group of experts. May they all be warmly thanked for their investment in this project.

2019 will, I am sure, be the year of all possible opportunities at the highest global level and the occasion to celebrate our 5 years of existence.


#### 2. Support provided by the Champ'seed Foundation

Champ'seed has for mission to select the most promising youths who don't have the needed resources and to empower them to achieve their potential in the sport they have chosen to compete in professionally.

With the support of 17 youths in 2018 as part of the charitable Junior Funding Program, Champ'seed Foundation continued to pursue the objectives of its mission statement:

- Seek to build sustainable relationships with the players thanks to our donors' support
- Make the average level progress for all the players eligible for grants provided by the foundation
- Take part in major international tournaments and win titles at the highest level worldwide.

The players were able to count on the assistance of the Champ'seed Foundation to finance a coach, a fitness trainer, medical monitoring, contribute towards travel expenses (accommodation, train and plane tickets, meals) in order to attend international competitions. These expenses are often doubled for these youths as they cannot travel alone.

#### 3. Schooling and sports education

Education is crucial for all youngsters, that they be gifted tennis players or not. Champ'seed Foundation seeks to encourage all players to actively pursue their academic education.

Champ'seed Foundation's commitment is specifically limited to the promotion in the public interest of the education of youngsters in need through tennis in any way the Board might find useful, including by:

- The attribution of grants to these youths based on capabilities to finance their practice, physical preparation, medical expenses and the use of necessary facilities and equipment for their education and training;
- The allocation of subsidies to cover travel expenses linked to the pursuit of such an education;
- The assistance and preparation of these youngsters to enter the professional world, on and off the courts.

The importance of a continuing education is recognized by the adapted schooling program, that the studies be pursued in a public or private school or through distance learning.

Champ'seed Foundation also has a relationship with the Mouratoglou Tennis Academy (MTA) which offers students a high-level sports and academic curriculum enabling to best combine intense training, tournaments and academic programs throughout the year. The ultimate goal is to guarantee to students a proper life project around sports and education leading to the professional circuit or an American university program with a focus on sports.

Champ'seed Foundation supports all players in the same way that they study at the MTA or follow another school education system.

#### II. 2018 HIGHLIGHTS

#### 1. Pro-AM & Champ'seed Gala

On the weekend of 16 & 17 June 2018, the fourth Champ'seed Foundation Charity Gala was held. A special tribute was paid to our guest of honor Martina Hingis, who came to celebrate with our group the end of her fabulous career on the tour.

The event was a resounding success for all the participants. Throughout the day on Saturday, the donors were given the opportunity to play in mixed doubles with the young talents of the Champ'seed Foundation who gladly played along for the occasion.

All the participants then traded their tennis gear for elegant evening attire to enjoy a traditional charity gala dinner that took place around the tennis-racket shaped swimming pool of the Beachcomber French Riviera Hotel\*\*\*\*. The theme of the evening was the white outfits of Wimbledon, the grand slam that was beginning a few weeks later.

One of the evening's highlights, was the fundraising auction organized by the Champ'seed Foundation, the profits of which were donated to the Junior Funding Program to support our current and future young talents. Guests were able to win prizes as precious as they were mythical, including the original racket with which Serena Williams won her tenth grand slam with Patrick Mouratoglou, the twenty-third of her career. Naming the Central Court of the Mouratoglou Academy was also a great success.

The next day, donors set foot on the courts again to participate in the Pro-AM tournament organized for the occasion with our celebrities. Among the guests around Martina, we had the pleasure of counting Marion Bartoli, Iva Majoli, Tatiana Golovin, Heidi El Tabakh, Varvara Lepchenko, Sébastien Grosjean and Thomas Enqvist.

#### 2. Weeks of training and selection

The periods of training for the players selected by Champ'seed Foundation stretch out throughout the year. As regards their respective programs, these young talents come to adjust their game and get advice from Patrick Mouratoglou and the rest of the team.

In addition to regular training periods, three major gatherings were held in 2018 to scout new talent. It is under the expert eye of Patrick Mouratoglou and Kerei Abakar, the technical coordinator, that some of these talents were invited to become members of the Champ'seed Foundation.

#### 3. Champ'seed Foundation's sporting successes in 2018



**Alexei Popyrin** (Australia) continued his meteoric rise and finished 2018 at the 147<sup>th</sup> place in the ATP ranking. It is the largest advancement in the ranking of players within the top 200 players in the world!

Chun Hsin "Jason" Tseng (Taipei) became the first Champ'seed Foundation player to be officially awarded the title of Word Junior No. 1-ranked tennis player in 2018. In 2018, he won two Grand Slam tournaments in France at Roland Garros and in London at Wimbledon. He finished 2018 by ranking No. 486 in the ATP.





**Lorenzo Musetti** (Italy) reached his first Junior Grand Slam final in New York at the US Open, he finished 4th in the Junior World Ranking.

**Holger Rune** (Denmark) won his first Davis Cup match at just 15 years old against a player ranked No. 317 in the ATP World Ranking! 2019 should see him play leading roles.

Cori "Coco" Gauff (USA) won the French Open at The French Junior Open at only 14 years old. She is in the top 4 of the youngest winners at Roland Garros Junior Girls, behind Martina Hingis, Jennifer Capriati and Gabriela Sabatini. She also won the prestigious Orange Bowl title and finished second in the Junior world rankings.





In 2018, **Linda Fruhvirtova**, at only 13 years old, obtained her first ITF Junior ranking and finished the year ranked no. 327.

Her sister, **Brenda Fruhvirtova** won the Eddie Herr tournament in her age category, she is one of the most promising young players in the world.

2019 promises to be an exciting year!


#### III. GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT: THE TEAM



#### 3. Technical coordination

Kerei Abakar has been the technical coordinator of the Champ'seed Foundation since January 2018.

Born on 24 February 1985, Kerei used to be second series in France and played in the American college division. Kerei is also and mainly a high-level coaching expert. He namely brought the French tennis player, Jérémy Chardy to his highest ranking in 2013 (ATP No. 25). Kerei likes getting involved on the courts in collaboration with players' individual coaches and he is the coach of Stefanos Tsitsipas with his father Apostolos Tsitsipas since 2015: they trained him towards his best tennis yet with a No.8 ATP ranking as of 10 April 2019.



In his role, Kerei is responsible for forwarding the files to the Group of Experts for review and validation.


